
In today's second reading, St. Paul is writing from prison to his beloved community at Philippi. He is sad to be away from them, and yet he tells them that he has learned to be content with whatever he has – whether hungry or well-fed, whether in the company of friends or alone in his prison

cell. And the "secret" behind Paul's happiness is his grateful spirit, his firm conviction that "*I can do all things through the One who strengthens me.*" Though grateful for all the external blessings, Paul knew that if he let his happiness depend on these, he could easily be disappointed. It is his relationship with Christ, his firm conviction that his life now belongs to Jesus "who loved me and gave himself for me", that allows him to choose joy and gratitude even in times of deprivation.
