Just for your information ... regarding a revised version of the "Lord's Prayer"

French Catholics, and French-Canadian Catholics began using a revised version of the Lord's Prayer in December 2018. The new version replaces a translation in place since the reforms of the Second Vatican Council.

In the modern French version of "Notre Père," produced in 1966, the sixth request to God, rendered in the standard English version as "Lead us not into temptation," was translated as "Ne nous soumets pas à la tentation," (Do not submit us to temptation).

Obviously, God – Who is Infinite and Unconditional Love – would not lead us into temptation.

The new version, agreed to by the French bishops in March 2018, reads "Ne nous laisse pas entrer en tentation" (Do not let us enter into temptation.)

It has been used in all Catholic churches in France, and in francophone Catholic churches in Québec since December 3, the first Sunday in Advent. This translation has also been approved by many French-language Protestant churches, and has been introduced in Belgium and in French speaking Africa.

What does this mean for you? For the English Catholics of Québec and the rest of Canada? Are you/we able to imagine a similar change for the English-language version of the "Our Father"?

Called to be Holy – A New Ministry

First we need to educate ourselves on environmental issues and then bring that information into the communities where we are involved. We will look at these actions in depth later on. If we really strive towards Creation Ministry we will be successful in making St. Monica's part of the Green Church and also making our daily living "Green".
